

PAPER SNOWFLAKE DINNER PLATE







MATERIALS

CCX156 Rimmed Dinner Plate
Snowflake Paper Pattern
Rubbing Alcohol
Fan Brush
Round Brush
Scissors
Straight Pin

COLORS

CMM 67 - Snowflake CMM 62 - Just Blue CMM 64 - Sky Blue CMM 47 - Deep Sea CMM 11 - Blue Lagoon




INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Use a fan brush to apply one generous coat of Snowflake paint to the center of the plate.
- 2. Follow the instructions on the snowflake pattern that you select for the plate. There are three options attached. Once you have your snowflake cut out, you can move on to step three.
- 3. Use a fan brush to apply a generous layer of water to the center of the plate.
- 4. Immediately press your snowflake into the water on the plate and smooth it down, working out air bubbles.
- 5. Apply one coat of Snowflake paint over the top of the snowflake. Allow that to dry until it is no longer shiny.
- 6. Use a fan brush to apply a generous layer of Just Blue to the center of the plate.
- 7. While the Just Blue is still damp, apply a generous layer of Deep Sea to the rim of the plate, then bring it down about an inch into the center, allowing the colors to blend.
- 8. Repeat steps 6-7, then allow the plate to dry until it is no longer shiny.
- 9. Thin down some Deep Sea with 50% water to 50% paint. Then, thin down some Blue Lagoon with 50% water to 50% paint.
- 10. Working quickly, apply a generous layer of the watered-down Deep Sea to the center of the plate.
- 11. Immediately dip your round brush into the rubbing alcohol and flick the alcohol onto the wet paint. You'll see a halo form where each drop lands.
- 12. Next, work quickly to apply a generous layer of the watered-down Blue Lagoon to the rim of the plate, then bring it in about an inch into the center of the plate.
- 13. Immediately dip your round brush into the rubbing alcohol and flick the alcohol onto the wet paint. You'll see a halo form where each drop lands.
- 14. When the plate is no longer shiny, use a straight pin to remove the paper snowflake.

TIPS


- The rubbing alcohol will evaporate as it sits on the palette, so don't pour it onto the palette until you're ready to use it.
- The top layer of paint needs to be wet when the alcohol is applied, so you'll want to work quickly laying that paint down.
- If you want more control over the halo spots, you can dip the brush into the rubbing alcohol and tap the tip of the brush onto the plate instead of flicking all over.








- 1. Cut out square
- 2. Flip paper over
- 3. Fold diagonally
- 4. Fold triangle in half
- 5. Keeping pattern in the center, fold outer sections to the back
